

Individuals Mentioned in the Diary of Charlotte Thorn Lewis.

This is a partial list of individuals mentioned in the diary. Family members are identified by their relationship to Charlotte Lewis. Women are listed by their maiden name but can be searched by their married name.

Three women were named Ann or Anna Burnham at various times.

Anna Hemple married George Burnham in 1843, Anna Burnham married Theodore Lewis in 1881, and Anna Lewis married George Burnham in 1881.

He was a partner in the ownership of the Baldwin Locomotive Works. He was active in many efforts to reform government including serving as a founding member of the Municipal League.

Burnham, George, Jr. (849-1924), Son-in-Law, Parents: George Burnham & Anna Hemple, Married: Anna Gilpin Lewis

A graduate of Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute, he entered the service of the Pennsylvania railroad company in 1872. In 1876, he formed a partnership with Nelson Stow for the manufacture of the Stow flexible shaft which became The Stow Flexible Shaft Co, Ltd of which he became secretary and treasurer. In 1880, he entered the Baldwin locomotive works, as an assistant in the purchasing department and became head of the financial department. He was associated with every movement for government reform from the 1890s until his death. He was president of the Municipal League of Philadelphia and was a founding of the National Municipal League. He was a founding member of the City Club of Philadelphia and served as its president for ten years. He was a member of the Church of the New Jerusalem (Swedenborgian).

He and his family lived at 214 N. 34th St. until his death in 1924.

She graduated from Women's Medical College in 1893. She was a fellow of the American Medical Association and a member of the Philadelphia Pediatric Society

He was in the hardware, iron and steel business until he retired in 1876. He was associated with the Women's Medical College. For many years, he resided in a large home at Powelton and N. 33rd St.

Lewis, Enoch (1821-1902), Husband, Parents: Evans Lewis Jr. & Sidney A. Gilpin, Married: Charlotte Smith Thorn.

Born into a Quaker family, he attended Westtown School from age 11 to 13. Beginning at age 15, he trained with Philadelphia locomotive builders Eastwick & Harrison. In 1844-'46, they sent him to Russia to work on the engineering of the railroad from Moscow to St. Petersburg. He then joined the Pennsylvania Railroad. From 1852-1857, he was Second Assistant Superintendent in charge of the Motive Power Dept. and car maintenance. He was General Superintendent of the Pennsylvania Railroad 1860-1866 and Purchasing Agent for the company from 1866-1893.

He was closely associated with the Unitarian Church in Philadelphia and was active in many progressive social causes including the Public Education Assoc. In 1880, the family lived at 224 Green St. in Philadelphia. In 1886, they moved to a new house at 3405 Powelton Ave.

She was educated in private schools and at the University of Pennsylvania, where she studied chemistry for three years. She was active in and served as president of the New Century Club. She met her future husband, Rev. William C. Gannett, a Unitarian minister, in the mid-1870s. Upon their marriage on November 3, 1887, they moved to Hinsdale, Illinois, where he was pastor of the Unitarian Church. In 1889, they moved to Rochester, N.Y.

A graduate of MIT, he became treasurer of the Standard Steel Co., a subsidiary of the Baldwin Locomotive Works. He and his family lived at 212 N. 34th St. from 1884 to 1917 when he and his wife took over the Lewis family home at 3405 Powelton Ave.

He was a mechanical engineer after whom the Lewis stress factor for gears was named. He was a recipient of the ASME Medal from the American Society of Mechanical Engineers in 1927.
