Charlotte Thorn Lewis

Charlotte Thorn Lewis (1823-1916) was the daughter of Isaac Thorn and Mary Woolley. She was born in Bordentown, New Jersey. In 1848, she married Enoch Lewis (1821-1902). They were reform activists and were friends of many of the most prominent reformers of the day including William Lloyd Garrison, Jane Addams, and Susan B. Anthony. This tradition of involvement in reform politics was continued by their children. Enoch Lewis was General Superintendent of the Pennsylvania Railroad 1860-1866 and Purchasing Agent for the company from 1866-1893. In 1880, the family lived at 224 Green St. in Philadelphia. In 1886, they moved to a new house at 3405 Powelton Ave.

Charlotte kept the diary in simple composition notebooks from 1880 until 1913. It was made available by her great-great-grandson, Richard Burnham Lewis.

In evening Enoch, aunt Nancy & I went to the Unitarian Club at New Century Drawing Room to hear Mr Salter's good paper well delivered. on Whittier and Mary Grew's very interesting personal recollections of the poet - she looked handsome and related them so well - it was a vivid recall of persecuting Anti Slavery times and of great interest to participants of the events of those

10th Monday. We are two miles from Asheville a town beautifully situated in an amphitheatre of hills - our hotel is on an elevation of 2100 ft above the sea & commands fine views in all directions and in the foreground are lovely homes on elevated points there being no necessity in this climate to crouch beneath the hills as we do in New England. I wrote in the evening to Anna & Sallie Langstreth. Music in the distance.

Tuesday 11th. We rode to Gen Vandenberg's place some four miles from here, where from three to five hundred men have been employed three years and probably will be for five years

April

more in building a palatial home of finely cut sandstone from Illinois: he has ten miles square of land which he is improving - intends to have 50 miles of macadamized road - is planting trees and shrubs extensively - has a fine dairy near here: it seems that his money may prove a boon to this region by employing many people and showing how land should be made of use to the community - many object lessons may be given and much stimulus to agricultural industry.

Took a walk after dinner to see the old log from which this house derives its name - simply a very old log at

a cottage once owned by an Englishman who had three plants set out: it is at the foot of the hill on which this inn stands. Evening reading Jane Field - by Mary Williams

12th. Note to May in the morning Letters from home last evening - first news since we left there. Cloudy morn with east wind. Rode along the Swannanoa showery pleasant ride tho.

13th. Rode to Richmond Hill & had a fine view.

14th. Friday. Rode the summit hill drive - finest view of all - Apple blossoms falling - Crab Apple beautiful with the red and pink buds. Lizzie May came in the afternoon 4.18 train.

15th Saturday. Mary & Lizzie

April

took a walk in the morning. Very clear atmosphere first since Tuesday. Note to May in afternoon 16th. Rode to Sunset Hill - clear beautiful weather - The Curtis & Mrs How & Switzers left. Evening in music room where five pieces discovered fine music.

17th. We rode over to G. W. Vanderbilt's growing palace. Clear & temperate Mercury 48 at 8 a m and 60 on the sunny side at 6 P. M. I wrote to Mrs C. S. Turner.

18th. Rode to Look out Mtn beyond Asheville. Letters came announcing the death of Louis Bonar Bro

on Friday last of Pneumonia.

19th. Rode along the picturesque Annapolis and on Beaumont Mt. Wrote to Mary Brewster and to May Garrison.

20th. Went to the Industrial School in charge of the Presbyterian Home Mission of the north. Mrs. Lawrence wife of the president very attractive. We drove to the Comally manor for the view of French Broad & the Mtus. stopped at mineral store & got some "elastic sandstone" peculiar to Burke Co. of this state.

21st. Morning packing. Left Billmors station at 3 P.M. reached Washington at 11.15 on

Saturday 22nd too late to take 11 train. called to see Mrs. Lewis & baby James, and took 12.15 train for Phila. called at Anna's. reached home & rested before tea. Geo. & Anna & Lewis & Theo. & Annie & Dorothy came to tea. Mrs. Baerham & Mary and Henry Justice came after tea.
