Dog Bites Man **Rescuing Three Tots From Fire**

Children Alone While Mother Was Working

Three children miraculously escaped being burned to death when mattress caught on fire in their bed-

room early Wednesday morning. Flames completely gutted middle bedroom of the first-floor apartment at 3321 Powelton ave., where the children, James Lloyd, 6; Rebecca Lloyd, 5; and Edith Lloyd, 2, were sleeping.

The children had been left alone by their mother, Mrs. Ida Lloyd, who left for work in the late afternoon believing their grandmother would soon be home to care for them.

The fire erupted shortly before midnight and less than an hour before Mrs. Lloyd was telling her employer that she had to quit so that she could spend the evening hours with her children.

AWAKENED BY COUGHING

Rebecca said she was awakened by the coughing of her younger sister, Edith, and she in turn called to her brother. The three of them, barefoot and in pajamas, rushed to the rear of the house them, and began screaming for help.

Powelton ave. He looked from his kitchen to see smoke gushing from the house.

Whitfield dashed through his back door, jumped the short fence between the two houses and was bitten by one of three dogs in the Lloyd's yard. He was treated at the Presbyterian Hospital.

FIVE OTHERS ROUTED

An unidentified man and Whitfield snatched up the children who were crying that they were cold and took them to the first-floor apartment of Mrs. Edna Nibblins, 3323 Powelton ave.

Also routed were Mr. and Mrs Graydon Flowers, and their three children, Priscilla, 3; Michael, 1; and Vicky, 9 months. They returned to their second-floor apartment after the blaze was extinguished. Firemen were able to confine the fire to the one bedroom.
